Initiating early enteral nutrition (EN) within 24-36 hours of admission to the ICU or within 12 hours of intubation and placement on mechanical ventilation should be the goal. In the patient unable to maintain volitional oral intake, early EN is recommended by both 2016 SCCM/ASPEN and 2019 ESPEN guidelines.1-3

### American Society for Parenteral and Enteral Nutrition

Current best practice recommendations are to ensure appro- priate infusion rates for fat emulsions (from 0.8 to 1.5 g/kg per day)and temporarily todiscontinue infusion if persistent (>72 h) hypertriglyceridemia occurs (>12 mmol/L) (C).

### Nutrition Support-ASHP

1.2 to 1.5g/kg of protein. 3-6g/kg of carbohydrate. go easy on the lipiuds (up to 2g/kg) Start feeding via a jejunal tube ( remember, this is a 2002 statement) If enteral nutrition is poorly tolerated and caloric goals are not being achieved, add some TPN but keep going with small-volume or elemental enteral feeding.

ASPEN 2014 GUIDELINES: PARENTERAL NUTRITION ORDERING, ORDER REVIEW, COMPOUNDING, LABELING AND DISPENSING •PICC, Hickman, central line(IJ), port-a-cath Central lines (most common) •Can only infuse up to 10% dextrose or 900mOsm/L Peripheral (rare) •0.22 micron for amino acid and dextrose solution (2 in 1)
